1. Welcome

Chairman Higgins opened the meeting at 10:02 AM.

2. Approval of July 30, 2019 Meeting Minutes

MOTION: Mayor Scroggs made a motion to approve the minutes of the July 30, 2019 meeting, with a second from Mayor Dunagan, and the motion passed by a unanimous vote.

3. Report from the Technical Coordinating Committee

Mr. Boyd, on behalf of the TCC Chair Adam Hazell, presented a summary of the Technical Coordinating Committee meeting held on September 4, 2019. The TCC recommended approval of all agenda items.

4. Report from the Citizens Advisory Committee

Mr. Boyd, on behalf of the CAC Chair Renee Gerrell, presented a summary of the Citizens Advisory Committee meeting held on September 12, 2019. The CAC recommended approval of all agenda items.

5. Approval of the Resolution Adopting the Jackson County Transportation Plan

Mr. Cote presented the transportation plan Jackson County has recently completed. This plan assessed Jackson County's existing transportation network and recommended a list of transportation projects for implementation over the next 30 years.

MOTION: Ms. Roy made a motion to approve the resolution adopting the Jackson County Transportation Plan, with a second from Commissioner Stowe, and the motion passed by a unanimous vote.

6. Approval of the Draft Project List for the Gainesville-Hall Regional Transportation Plan: 2020 Update

Mr. Cote presented a draft financially-constrained list of transportation projects that would be included in the next update of the Gainesville-Hall Regional Transportation Plan. The projects with federal funding were broken into four time bands: Band 1 (2020-2025), Band 2 (2026-2030), Band 3 (2031-2040), and Band 4 (2041-2050). There is an additional list of transportation projects with other (state and local) funding sources. Mr. Cote noted that project R-9, the I-85 Widening from State Route 53 to State Route 11/US 129, was shown in Band 1 with additional Major Mobility Investment Program (MMIP) funding contributed towards this project by GDOT. This change from the previous project list presented would allow for other local projects to move up to earlier time bands within the project list.

<u>MOTION</u>: Mayor Dunagan made a motion to approve the draft project list for the Gainesville-Hall Regional Transportation Plan: 2020 Update, with a second from Ms. Roy, and the motion passed by a unanimous vote.

7. Jurisdiction and Agency Reports

Representatives shared the status of transportation projects being completed by their jurisdictions: Mr. Andrew for the City of Flowery Branch, Mr. Tarver for the City of Gainesville, Mr. Brown for the City of Oakwood, Mr. McInturff for Hall County, Mr. Robinson for GDOT, and Ms. Roy for Jackson County.

9. Public Comment

Darlene Long of the Martin Road Stakeholder Committee thanked the MPO and Hall County for their work on the upgrades to Martin Road and the new roundabout at the intersection of J M Turk Road and Martin Road. She stated that the community is still having issues with trucks utilizing Martin Road as an illegal cut through between State Route 13 and State Route 53. She requested that larger signage stating "Martin Road is a No Truck Zone" be installed along State Route 13 as well as coming off the newly opened Exit 14. Ms. Long also requested that an official truck route be designated in the area to help guide trucks to the correct routes of travel. Mr. Robinson responded that he would need to look into the signage and truck route questions and would follow up shortly.

No other items were presented to the committee for discussion.
